
The Catalan Sport Observatory (CSO) is an instrument adressed to people and public and private social agents involved in the field of sports in Catalonia. The last study that CSO has produced "The labor market in the context of sport in Catalonia" shows the profile of the people that currently work in the sport market, in a disciplinary environment and with a noticeable increase in the last years. The aim of this poster is to show the differential situation between different years of sports graduates.




METHODS


The sample was 1.000 people from a universe of 8.376 graduates since 1980, proportional sample for each academic year (n=1.000; SD +/-3%; IC=95 %). Data was collected by means of an online-based survey with closed answers.

RESULTS






Average number of jobs according to the year of graduation







CONCLUSIONS

Labour conditions of graduates in sports sciences are better for the older classes than the newer graduates, but as they get experience and/or contacts, they will have an established career that will allow them access to positions with more responsibility, stability and salary. In addition, we can identify important changes in relation to the main areas of employment. For instance, nowadays only 21% of the newer graduates are working as a teachers, whereas all of graduates in 1980-1984 are teachers.
